Subject: Conflicting Minerals Compliance Statement

Dear Valued Customer:

The United States Congress passed legislation in July of 2010 requiring corporations to report the use of "Conflict Minerals" in the manufacture of their products. The current law, generally referred to as the "Conflict Minerals Law", was included as Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act, passed by the US Senate on May 20, 2010 and signed by President Barack Obama on July 21, 2010.

"Conflict Minerals" in this context refers to specific minerals originating from mines controlled by armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or adjoining countries. The specific metals in question are: Gold, Tantalum, Niobium, Tin, Iron, Manganese, and Tungsten.

We do not knowingly source any product containing Conflict Minerals from the DRC Countries and will continue our due diligence work on this process. At this time, we are not aware of the use of any Conflict Minerals by our selected supplier network.
